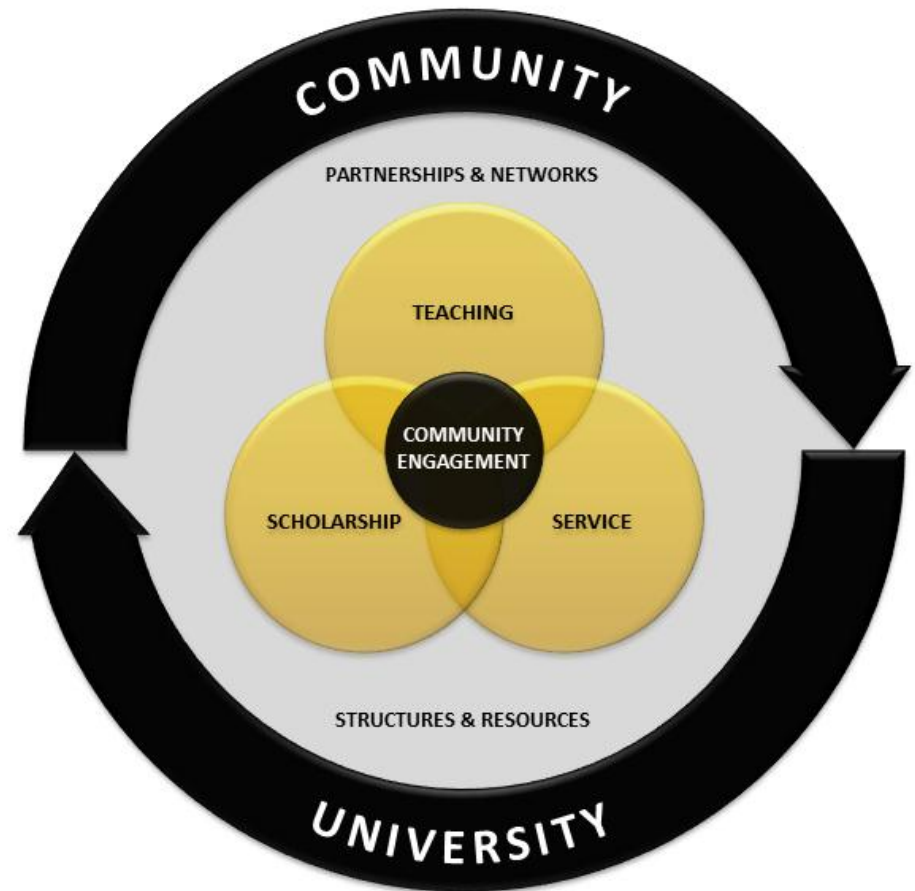
# Purpose of *Engage KSU*

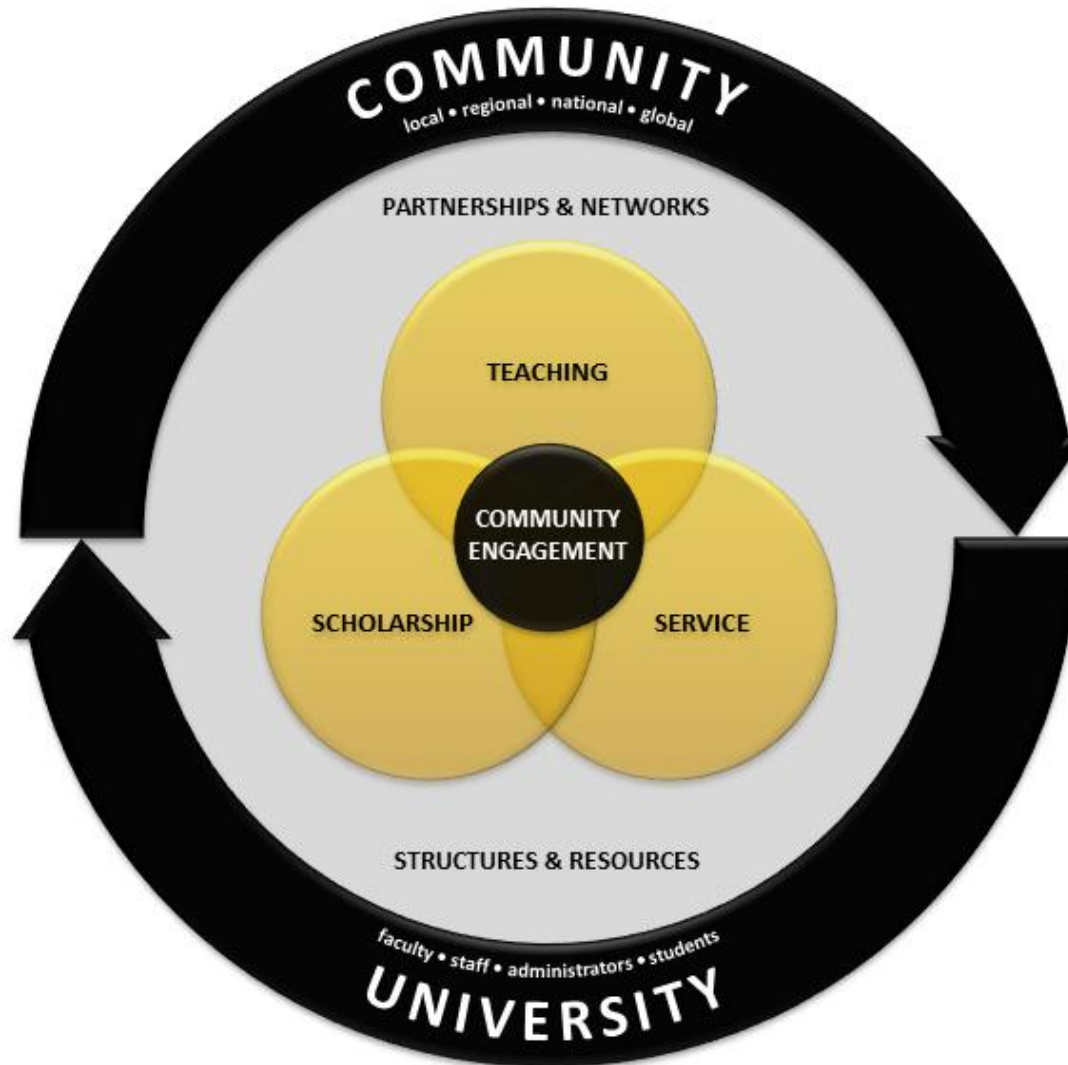

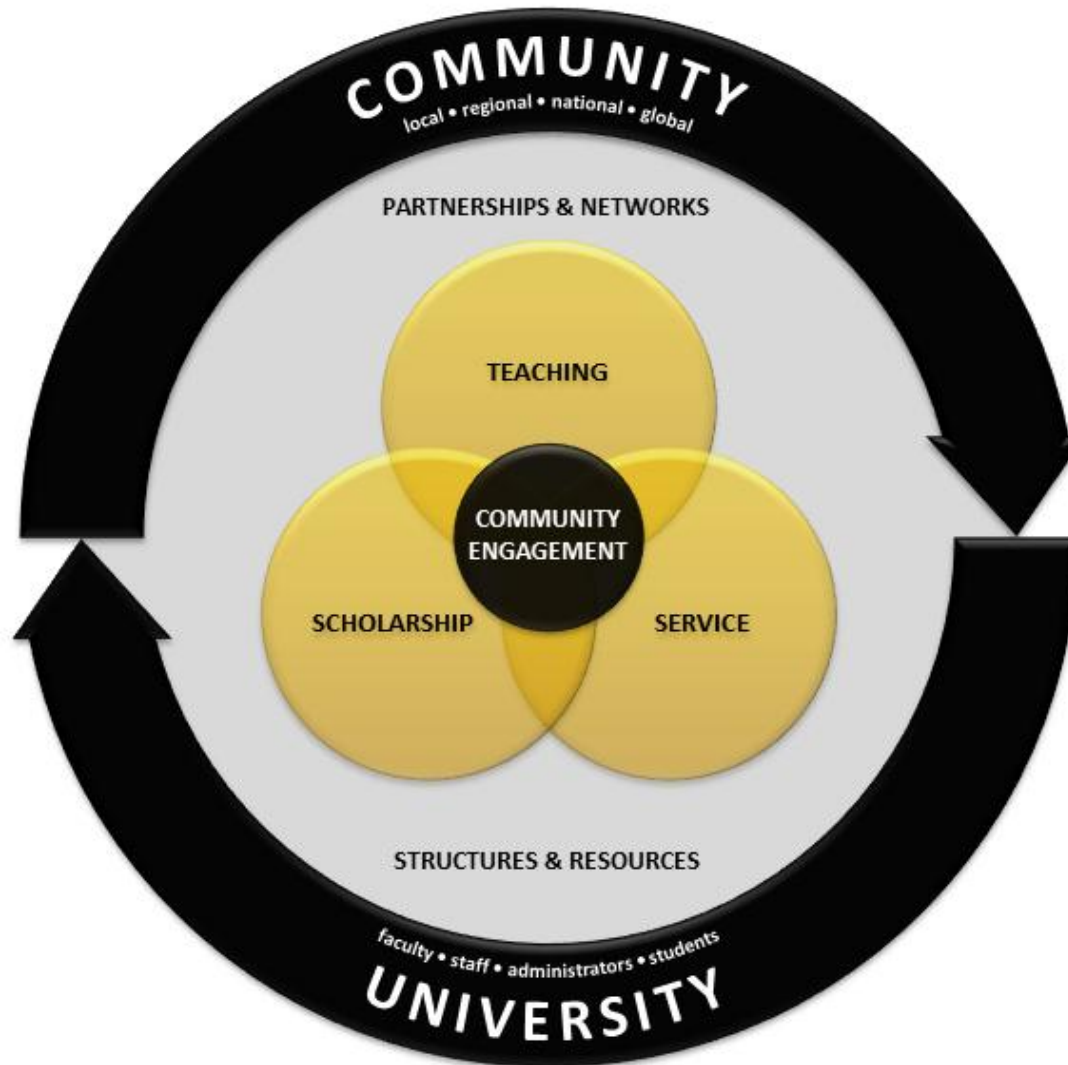
